COUNSELING/CASE MANAGEMENT

Suicide

- · Discuss a voluntary referral to counseling services
- Explore stressors and identify escalation triggers
- · Connect the individual to peer and social supports and inspire hope

Depression

- Discuss a voluntary referral to counseling services
- · Explore stressors and identify any source of their depression
- Encourage healthy eating, exercise, and social connections

Self-Injury

- · Discuss a voluntary referral to counseling services
- Determine if the self-injury is suicidal or non-suicidal
- Identify stressors and connect the individual to supports and resources

Manic Thought/Action

- · Identify high risk behaviors and engage in harm reduction
- · Discuss any interruption of academics, relationships, and life skills
- Make a referral to academic support
- · Encourage counseling referral and offer to walk them to the clinic
- · Discuss medication options

POLICE/CONDUCT

Substantive Threats

- · Facilitate a meeting with conduct, parents/emergency contact, and police
- · Use the progressive disciplinary policy through conduct
- Consider suspension or a short-term leave
- · Consider notifying the threatened party
